  Explain the TWO ways in which this change is presented. (4 Marks)
- 3. Mary and John are fraternal twins who are so different in terms of how they interact with others.

  Distinguish between introvert and extrovert types of personality. (4 Marks)
- 4. Adolescent counsellors need to ensure that the therapy rooms have the necessary resources to facilitate counselling. Outline any FOUR of these resources. (4 Marks)
- 5. An effective counsellor is knowledgeable on how to apply the various counselling skills. Identify any FOUR ways in which probing skill an effectively be applied. (4 Marks)
- 6. An effective counsellor needs to be ethical. List any FOUR unethical behaviour s that may affect the adolescent counselling process (4 Marks)
- 7. A counsellor has the ethical and legal obligation to get informed consent from each client. State any FOUR important pieces of information that should be included in the adolescent counselling contract. (4 Marks)

She wears baggy clothes to hide her physical development. She has a crush on James, her neighbour, who is in college. She spends most of her alone time daydreaming about "their" future together.
  - a. Identify the psychosocial and psychosexual stages of development depicted in this scenario.

  - c. Magdalene has been referred to you for psycho-education on adolescent development. Explain to her any FIVE behaviour problems experienced by adolescents her age. (10 Marks)

  - a. Explain FOUR reasons for follow-up services after termination of the adolescent counselling process. (8 Marks)
  - b. Janet is an adolescent counsellor and is experiencing resistance from her client. Janet is advised to seek supervision. As a supervisor, explain any SIX types of supervision that you may adopt to assist Janet.
