### SECTION B: ANSWER TWO QUESTIONS FROM THIS SECTION

- 9. a) Salimah is a 32-year-old woman who recently experienced a significant loss in her life when her long-term romantic relationship ended abruptly. Since then, Salimah has been struggling to cope with overwhelming feelings of sadness, anger, and confusion. Despite her efforts to move on, she finds herself constantly thinking on what went wrong and feeling paralyzed by fear of the future. Using Freud's theory of ego-defense mechanisms, discuss five coping mechanisms she can employ to deal with her predicament. (10 marks)
  - b). Tom is a college student who is struggling to stay motivated and focused on his studies. Despite his initial enthusiasm for his courses, he finds himself increasingly disengaged and procrastinating on assignments. Tom's grades have started to decline, and he is worried about his academic performance. Discuss five factors that can influence Tom's behaviour and academic outcomes. (10 marks)
- 10. a) Alex, a 21-year-old individual, has recently been reflecting on his life experiences and struggles with defining his identity. He finds himself pondering

his career choices, relationships, and sense of purpose. Additionally, Alex is questioning the societal expectations placed upon him regarding gender roles and expressions. Discuss Erik Erikson's stages of personality development, focusing on Alex's current stage of psychosocial development. (10 marks)

- b) David, a 22-year-old Kenyan college student, recently came out as gay to friends and family. Explain the challenges David is likely to face in college as he explores his identity within a diverse social context. (10 Marks)
- 11. Zuwena, a 14-year-old, was sitting in a science class watching a film. All of a sudden, she started feeling really strange. Her ears seemed to be stuffed with cotton and her vision was very dim. She was cold, had broken out in a sweat, and felt extremely afraid for no good reason. Her heart was racing and she immediately became convinced that she was dying. A friend sitting behind her saw how pale she had become and tried to ask her what was wrong, but Zuwena couldn't speak. She was in a state of panic and couldn't move. The friend got the teacher's attention, who motioned Zuwena to come over to him. Although she would have sworn she couldn't move, she stood up to go to him and immediately everything returned to normal.
  - a). Reflecting on the above case study, identify what disorder Zuwena could be suffering from. (2 marks).
  - b) Justify the answer above (a) using three relevant examples. (3 marks)
  - c). Discuss five intervention measures you can employ in managing the disorder.
