- 3. Client orientation to assessment is one of the responsibilities of a counsellor. List any FOUR stages involved in the orientation process of clients. (4 Marks)
- 4. Before conducting an assessment on a client, it is important to collect client bio-data. Outline any FOUR information that is included in bio-data. (4 Marks)
- 5. Psychological testing and assessment can be carried out in a variety of settings. List any FOUR settings that assessment can be done. (4 Marks)
- 6. Counsellors who conduct assessment rely on diagnostic manuals such as the DSM V. Identify and FOUR mental disorders that you are likely to assess. (4 Marks)

The class tutor has noticed this and has sent Jacques to your counselling center after several attempts to talk to him.
 - a. Identify Jacques's stage of development according to Sigmund Freud, Erik Erikson and Jean
 Piaget. (6 Marks)
 - b. State any FOUR tests you can administer during an assessment with Jacques. (4 Marks)
 - c. Explain any FIVE benefits of having a positive self-esteem especially to Jacques and his age mates. (10 Marks)
- 12. Documentation is an important process in the counselling profession.
 - a. Explain any FIVE documents that a counsellor may keep especially in the assessment process. (10 Marks)
 - b. Describe any FIVE benefits of record keeping in the practice of counselling. (10 Marks)
- 13. The type of assessment instruments you are most likely to use in your counseling practice depends largely on the setting in which you are working, the age of the clients you see and the problems you are likely to encounter.
 - a) Describe five assessment instruments used by professional counselors (10 marks)
