- 11. Participatory monitoring and evaluation is the collective examination and assessment of a program or project by the stakeholders and beneficiaries. It is reflective; action oriented and seeks to build capacity of the stakeholders more so the primary beneficiaries. Participatory monitoring and evaluation is an umbrella term for a set of new approaches that stress the importance of making local peoples perspective into account and giving them a greater say in planning and managing the evaluation process. Local people, community organizations, NGOs and other stakeholder agencies decide together how to measure results and what actions should follow once this information has been collected and analyzed. The emphasis on participatory goes beyond the choice of particular methods and techniques to a wider consideration of who initiates and undertakes the evaluation process and who learns and benefits from the findings. Recent literature stresses the significance of attitudes and behaviors as integral to a Participatory approach. Required,
