1. Research has shown that many people consciously or unconsciously abuse drugs and substances. State FOUR circumstances under which drugs are abused and misused.

- Psychoactive drugs have short-term and long-term effects on the Central Nervous System.
  Outline FOUR classifications of these psychoactive drugs. (4 Marks)
- Several factors contribute to the initiation, continuation and maintenance of drug use. State FOUR risk factors leading to drug use. (4 Marks)
- 4. When conducting intake and screening of clients with substance use problems, addiction counsellors should prioritize gathering comprehensive information to assess the client's needs, risks, and treatment options effectively. Mention FOUR aspects of information that an addiction counsellor should pick during intake and screening of clients with substance use problems. (4 Marks)
- 5. No single treatment is appropriate for everyone because it depends on the type of drug and the characteristics of the patient. Therefore, screening evaluates the possible presence of a particular problem. Identify FOUR relevant screening tools that can be used for this purpose. (4 Marks)
- The reaction rate of a drug in the body depends on the method of administration. List FOUR routes of drug administration by drug users. (4 Marks)
