- 11. Lily is 14 years old. She's the last born in her family. She's in form one at a well performing public school. She has been brought for counselling because she has been having migraines while in school. She says the school is too competitive and she is not performing so well. Her grades are good but because of the competition, she ranks lower than she wanted to. She's now very frustrated and wants to change schools. She wants to go to a school with an international curriculum because most of her friends are in such schools. She says things are easier there. Her father has refused to take her there and tells her that he cannot afford it. She's convinced that he can afford to take her to such a school and that he's just being stubborn. She's threatening to take her own life to punish him. She says she's suffering and yet she's not the one who chose that school. She says her mother has always allowed her to choose what she wants to do with her life.
 - a) Using the above case study, answer the following questions
 - i. Identify the origin of Lily's problem according to the behavioral theory? (2 Marks)
 - ii. Discuss FOUR problems that Lily has using the concepts of the Rational Emotive Behaviour Therapy. (8 Marks)
 - c) Explain FOUR theoretical techniques that you would apply to help the above client. (10 Marks)
- 12. John, a 17-year-old form three student at Nairobi school is feeling overwhelmed by the pressure to perform well academically and qualify for medical school. He has been experiencing frequent headaches, difficulty sleeping, and a lack of appetite. His parents have noticed that he is becoming increasingly withdrawn and irritable.
